The Camargue island, between the Rhône and the Mediterranean sea, has an exceptional environment. It is the result of the meeting of fresh and salt water and the human activities that have developed there.

A museum

Housed in a former sheepfold, the Camargue Museum implements the cultural activities of the Camargue Regional Natural Park. Its permanent exhibition, “The flow of water, the flow of time,” tells the story of the territory through objects, interactive installations, videos, and contemporary artworks. Temporary exhibitions are presented throughout the year. A visit to the museum is essential to understand the Camargue in a new light.

A discovery trail

The 4,8 km landscaped path allows visitors to explore the diverse environments and landscapes of the northern delta. It runs alongside irrigation canals and crosses farmland, salt marshes, reedbeds, and wetlands.

A cultural program

Throughout the year, shows, meetings, debates and themed visits in the museum or within the Park territory offer a fun and varied approach to Camargue culture.





We welcome groups of 10 or more throughout the year. You can book a self-guided tour and enjoy our audioguides available in seven languages ; or choose a guided tour available in three languages. The guided option allows you to explore our exhibitions with a local guide who will share with your group his passion for the Camargue region.

Guided tour

- Guided tours are available in French, Provençal, and English
- Our guides can accommodate adults, students and school groups, adapting to all levels
- Our visits presents the region and its history through the museum's permanent exhibition
- Duration : 1h
- Price : €7,50/person - Free for the group leader



Self-guided tour

- Audioguides are available in French, English, Italian, German, Spanish, Dutch and Provençal
- The self-guided tour of our exhibitions can be complemented by exploring the 4.8 km discovery trail showcasing the landscapes of the northern delta
- Duration: 1h30 inside the museum / 1h30 in the discovery trail
- Price : €5/person - Free for the group leader
